



Community History Research Fellowship

This 265-hour position involves working with the recipient of the 2021-22 Huron University College Doctoral Fellowship in African Canadian History, to support the recipient's research program. In this position, the successful applicant will work under the direction of the Doctoral Research Fellow. Duties will include: research using resources of Western Libraries and the Archives and Regional Collections Centre; compiling bibliographies; organizing research notes and teaching materials; transcribing interviews; providing updates to the Huron Community History Centre; and other research duties as required.

The Huron Community History Centre supports local communities and organizations in producing their own histories, and historical resources, by providing access to faculty, student and university resources, in addition to supporting the History department's community-based research programs, and commitment to collaborative undergraduate research learning.

The successful candidate will have a strong academic record, with well-developed written and verbal communication skills. Proficiency with digital platforms such as Wordpress is expected alongside a willingness to learn new software (including transcription software) as required. Preference will be given to students enrolled in Huron's History program and who have completed HIS 281 1F, HIS 2204G, HIS 2302G, HIST 2710F.
