



Community History Research Fellowship

This 350-hour position involves working on a variety of community-history projects affiliated with Huron's History Department and Community History Centre. The majority of the fellow's time will involve working under the direction of Prof. Thomas Peace on a digital archive related to the operation of the Mohawk Institute.

The Huron Community History Centre supports local communities and organizations in producing their own histories, and historical resources, by providing access to faculty, student and university resources, in addition to supporting the History department's community-based research programs, and commitment to collaborative undergraduate research learning.

The successful candidate will have a strong academic record, with well-developed written and verbal communication skills. Proficiency with digital platforms such as Wordpress is expected alongside a willingness to learn new software, such as Mukutu, as required. Preference will be given to students enrolled in Huron's history program and who have completed HIS 2811F, HIS 2204G, HIS 2302G, HIS 3201E; a background in Indigenous Studies is an asset.
