



Community History Research Fellowship

This 265-hour position involves working on a SSHRC-funded research project focused on creating a digital tool for the teaching of Munsee-Delaware History and Language. In this position, the successful applicant will edit video, create digital maps, and a website based on material provided by the History and Language group at Munsee-Delaware First Nation. The majority of the fellow's time will involve working under the direction of Prof. Thomas Peace as well as members of the history and language group.

The Huron Community History Centre supports local communities and organizations in producing their own histories, and historical resources, by providing access to faculty, student and university resources, in addition to supporting the History department's community-based research programs, and commitment to collaborative undergraduate research learning.

The successful candidate will have a strong academic record, with well-developed written and verbal communication skills. Proficiency with digital platforms such as Wordpress is expected alongside a willingness to learn new software as required. Preference will be given to students enrolled in Huron's history program and who have completed HIS 2811F, HIS 2204G, HIS 2302G, HIS 3201E; a background in Indigenous Studies is an asset.
