The Huron Community History Centre supports local communities and organizations in producing their own histories, and historical resources, by providing access to faculty, student and university resources, in addition to supporting the History department's community-based research programs, and commitment to collaborative undergraduate research learning.

This position involves working with Dr. Nassisse Solomon and Dr. Reid-Maroney on a SSHRCfunded community history project called *Our Roots in Activism: Finding Agency and Allyship in Histories of Anti-racist Mobilizing in Canada*. Working with our community partners, the successful candidate will assist with organizing community workshops, gathering project data, and creating the project's Arc-GIS map to record findings. For the most part, the position involves working remotely with the Huron Community History Centre, but some on-campus training and local travel in southwestern Ontario will be required. The successful candidate will have a strong background in Black History and community engagement, and an interest digital mapping.
