OUR NEW MINORS

JOINT MINOR IN PUBLIC HISTORY

Huron's joint minor in Public History is the first undergraduate Public History program in Canada. You can combine the module with a History degree, or with other disciplines such as Archaeology, Classics, Geography, Visual Art, and Media, Information and Technoculture. The module will introduce you to Public History, and provide practical experience in the field.

HISTORIES OF AFRICA AND AFRICAN DIASPORAS

This module combines core History courses with choices in Political Science, English, Geography, Religious Studies, and Women's Studies, introducing complex histories of Africa and the African Diaspora as well as the legacies of those histories in our own time.

PACIFIC RIM STUDIES

This module offers interdisciplinary and cross-regional of East Asia and North America, focusing on the common. comparative, and interactive aspects of the lives of the peoples in the Pacific Rim region, and including courses in History, Chinese, Japanese, English, and Political Science. The Pacific Rim Studies Minor will introduce a diversity of approaches, primary sources and intellectual traditions in this dynamic and transnational research area.

WORLD HISTORY

The World History Minor focuses on the common, comparative, and interactive aspects of World History, with three credits in History and one credit chosen from English. Global Studies, Political Science, Philosophy, Film Studies, First Nations Studies, Religious Studies or French and Asian studies.
